Field Trips

An orientation by Family Museum staff followed by a self-guided exploration of all the permanent and traveling exhibit galleries. Education staff will be on hand with extra hands-on activities from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm in our Art Studio.

- **Available Times**

Tuesday - Friday, anytime between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm

- **Fee**

\$5 per child in a school group, \$2 for those who meet the Federal free and reduced lunch program guidelines, and \$6 per child for groups not associated with a school district. Children who have memberships to the Family Museum are NOT allowed to use their membership on a group visit, **but chaperones who have a membership ARE allowed to use theirs.**

- **Chaperones**

One adult for every FIVE children is required and will be admitted free. Additional adults are \$5 each for school groups; \$6 each for groups not associated with a school district. **Entering ThinkShop requires one adult for every three children. Please bring extra chaperones if you are planning on visiting this exhibit.**

- **Exhibits**

Discover hands-on fun inspired by the Quad Cities! Our galleries include a *Town Square* filled with the people and places of a city, a *Farm* with food and animals, a *River and Bridges* exhibit with a 28-foot indoor waterplay table, and a *PlayHouse* for our youngest guests to play in. We also have a private outdoor area with a playground. Make sure to check our calendar for Drop-In programming offered on the day you visit!

Family Museum Outreach

Fab Five Senses - (Pre-K)

These fun activities encourage children to examine their environment with all their senses. Play a game that uses hearing and make a gingerbread man that uses feeling, smelling, and hearing.

NEW! Ramp and Roll - (Pre-K - 1st Grade)

Discover force and motion, cause and effect, and more science concepts while playing with ramps, cars, and balls. Students create fun engineering experiments that help them internalize science phenomena.

It's a Dino Life! - (Pre-K - 1st Grade)

Get to know the dinosaurs! Become little paleontologists and look at how dinosaurs are different. Examine the differences between the meat eaters and plant eaters. Play a dinosaur game and make a dinosaur puppet.

Bubble Wonder (Grades Pre-K -3)

Become a bubble-ologist and discover the unique properties of bubbles. Experiment with many different ways of making bubbles, bubble shapes, and colors.

Creepy Crawly Critters (Grades K - 2)

Get buggy and come eye-to-antennae with real live insects. Make a life cycle model and identify insects and non-insects.

Little Engineers (Grades K-3)

Work through the engineering design process, defining the question, imagining and planning a solution, creating a solution based on the plan, testing and improving the design. Which team can build a paper bridge that can hold the most weight?

Love Affair of Maggie Nets (Grades K-3)

Build knowledge about magnets and demonstrate basic principles of magnetism.

Sound Science (Grades K-3)

Check out the vibrations all around us and explore seeing, feeling, and hearing sounds. Make a vibrating cup.

Polymer Play (Grades 1 - 6)

Look! Is it a solid? Is it a liquid? No! It's a polymer. Learn about states of matter, chemistry, and strange molecules called polymers - all while experimenting with slime!

Gadgets and Gizmos (Grades 3-5)

Explore the simple machines - levers, wedges, pulleys, inclined planes, gears, screws and more on our amazing "Tennis Ball Bowling Gizmo." Students create a new contraption that will push, pull, roll, and do work.

Push Pull Forces (Grades 3-5)

Observe the forces of push, pull, and friction to makes things go, change direction, or stop. Build a roller coaster that's really fast... or maybe slow. (An open floor space is required.)

Solids and Liquids and Gases... Oh My! (Grades 3-5)

Investigate the properties of matter through open-ended, hands-on activities that explore solids, liquids, and gases. Learn lab safety while using dry ice. (Hot and cold water required.)

Spin It! (Grades 3-5)

Discover the science of rotation in art, toys, and paper helicopters.

Outreach Information

- Programs are designed to be presented to one class group of approximately 25 students at a time.
- Students should come to the presentation rather than moving the presentation.
- Programs (even with multiple sessions) are limited to one topic per day.

Session Length: 50 minutes per class

Availability: Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays; September-May

Program Cost per Session*:

- 1 Session: \$100
- 2 Sessions: \$160
- 3 Sessions: \$200
- 4 Sessions: \$240
- 5 Sessions: \$280
